Jeff Hill, RPh

Jeffrey D. Hill, RPh, has been a pharmacist and pharmacy owner for more than 30 years at Milford Pharmacy & Wellness Center and Hill's Compounding Pharmacy in Milford, OH. He began his career after graduating from the University of Cincinnati in 1978 and has been compounding since 1990. His expertise in compounding allows him to be a problem solver for patients in both human and veterinary medicine. He has worked extensively with physicians and veterinarians to create specialized dosage forms and innovative formulations. He is an Adjunct Assistant Professor of Pharmacy Practice and Administration Sciences at the University of Cincinnati, and his work has been featured in the International Journal of Pharmaceutical Compounding, Cincinnati Magazine, The Cincinnati Enquirer, and other media outlets.

Don Harris, DVM

Dr. Don J. Harris came to Florida in 1980 following his graduation from Louisiana State University School of Veterinary Medicine. Although his Cajun background in the swamps of Louisiana did nothing to prepare him for life in Miami, it did provide for him a wealth of experience in handling wildlife and exotic animals. After several years in mixed animal practice Dr. Harris became so busy with exotics that he felt he was unable to devote appropriate time to dogs and cats. His practice became exclusively avian and exotic in 1990, and he opened Miami's first exotics-only veterinary hospital, Avian & Exotic Animal Medical Center, in 1996. The quality of Dr. Harris' practice is reflected in his international reputation. He has received numerous invitations to speak at veterinary conferences both nationally and internationally every year, as well as many commendations over the years from various institutions and associations. He served as president of the South Florida Veterinary Medical Association, president of the worldwide Association of Avian Veterinarians, and is past-president of the North American Veterinary Conference, the largest veterinary conference in the world. Additionally, his clinical experiences have been featured on major television networks including NBC, CBS, ABC, CNN, Animal Planet, and Ripley's Believe it or Not.

Tom Wynn has over 14 years of compounding experience. He completed his pharmacy studies at the University of Cincinnati and received his Bachelor of Pharmacy. He is currently on faculty at the University of Cincinnati College of Pharmacy and works as a Pharmacy Consultant at Fagron Academy. Mr. Wynn has a compounding focus in HRT, veterinary, and wound care. He has published multiple case studies in areas of wound, pain, and pediatrics. Mr. Wynn has worked in community pharmacy practice setting the majority of his pharmacy career. He brings insight into common problems faced by compounders today.
